John Clayton. Britt (1) 1841 – 1921 and Fannie Bell Deloatch Britt 1872 – 1921

- But when I started my research the name, I was given was Ralph Walden Britt. Ralph owned a local store and openly acknowledged we were related. And JC also spoke of this family of Britt beginning related. (I will check my notes I have from JC again)
- Surprisingly most of the Bitt names below me have heard about. Charlie Britt, Sam Britt, and Hurbert. (I will send a picture of the white Britt's)
- I just don't know which white Britt would be the mom or dad. So I have to go back to my notes
- The white Britt's are buried in Severn Cemetery, Severn VA (near First Baptist Seven. NC)
- Britt names: Charlie Britt, Sam Britt, and Hurbert.

Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc.: **Local Chapter History:** The North Carolina Piedmont Triad Chapter, a nonprofit organization, **was founded in June 1998 under the leadership of Lamar E. DeLoatch** and Jack Dewar.

[THE DeLOATCH SECTION] Caucasian / White race

By 1860, the DeLoatch family in Northampton County owned 186 slaves. They own slaves in the North Hampton county area.

- Michael Desloges 1645-1710

Founder of the Deloatch -DeLoache - Deloatch family in America

(Michael was a white servant who became a slave owner. He hopped on a boat from France. He married well a plantation owner's daughter

- William Deloatch 1678-1748

On 6 June 1731 William DeLoach, Jr., was granted 350 acres of land situated on the south side of Meherrin River, in that part of old Bertie County, N.C., which in 1741 was formed into Northampton County. (North Carolina State/Colonial Records, Vol. 4, page 624.) – Hereafter mentioned as William Deloatch.

- Francis Deloatch 1710-1770 (Died in North Hampton City)
- Francis Deloatch II 1738-1814 (Owned our 6x great grandparents)
- Francis Deloatch III 1795-1856 (Produced a child with Chaney (slave) Child name Exum)

Michel Desloges

Also Known As: "DeLoach", "de Loach"

Birthdate: 1645

Birthplace: Magland, Rhône-Alpes, France

Death: Died 1710 in Isle of Wight, Virginia, United States

Place of Burial: Isle of Wight, Virginia, United States

Immediate Family: Son of Michel Crepin DesLoges and Marie Nicole Vallence DesLoges
Husband of Jane DesLoges
Father of Michael Deloach, Jr.; William Michael DeLoach, Sr. and Thomas DeLoach, Sr.

About Michel Desloges

It is likely that all persons in the United States with the surname of DeLoach, DeLoache, DeLoatch, or any of the other variant spellings, are descendants of Michel DesLoges.

He was a **French Huguenot refugee who departed Bristol, England in 1663 for the Virginia Colony**. At some point after his arrival, he anglicized his name to Michael DeLoach. He had the good fortune of meeting and marrying Jane Griffith, the only daughter of plantation owner Rowland Griffith. When Rowland died, he willed Jane and Michael his plantation, upon which they prospered and raised their family. **Their descendants spread down the Atlantic Coast, through the Carolinas to Georgia**. Following the American Revolution, they began moving westward through Tennessee to Kentucky, Alabama, and other states that were part of the American frontier. Source: From: <http://desloges.us/>

Listed as Michael Deloge in the passenger list sailing from Bristol, England. Came to America as servants to Foreign Plantations. Ref: Bristol and America; a Record of the First Settlers in the Colonies of North America from Records of the City of Bristol, England by R.S. Glover, 1929. In 'The Bristol Registers to Servants to Foreign Plantations 1654-1689', by Peter Wilson Coldham, page 196, **Michael Deloge is listed as a servant to Charles Taplady** in Virginia for four years, beginning 24 Aug 1663.

When Michael DesLoges arrived in America, he was an unmarried man of about 19 years of age. He settled in Isle of Wight County, where he became engaged as an apprentice tailor under Charles Taplady. It is conjectured that his parents and/or grandparents owned and operated a tailoring establishment in France or England, and that Michael served an apprenticeship in that establishment before coming to Virginia. As a newcomer to the colony, he received a grant of 50 acres of land, but its location has not been determined.

In about 1668, Michael married Jane Griffith, the only child of Rowland Griffith who, if not a native of Wales, was of Welsh descent. On 9 April 1663, Governor Francis Morrison of Virginia granted to Rowland Griffith 765 acres of land situated on Blackwater River in Isle of Wight County. By his will, dated 9 August 1671, Rowland Griffith gave 'all of my estate to Jane DesLoges, my only daughter and now wife unto Michael DesLoges, Taylor'. Michael and/or Jane might have died shortly before or during 1719. The number of children born to them is not known. There were probably one or more daughters who married, but due to loss of records, cannot now be identified as members of the family. Also, there were probably one or more children who died before reaching maturity. However, records of the time which escaped loss or destruction furnish circumstantial evidence (which has been accepted as proof) that they were the parents of three sons who grew to maturity, married, and left surviving children.
